

School Commencement and Pick Up

It is disappointing that we are once again having to remind parents of school start and finish times. As communicated previously, school starts at 8:50am and families are encouraged to have students at school from 8:35am onwards. Having 5 - 10 minutes in the yard with their friends, prior to commencing classes, can make the world of difference for many of our students in setting up for a successful start to the day. Students arriving after 8:50am, will not have the opportunity to play with their friends in the yard, which can lead to them wanting to talk with their friends when school has started and learning has commenced. In addition, students arriving in class after 8:50am miss the routines that teachers have set up in classrooms. Late arrivals disrupt other students and the teacher, interrupting the grade's start to the day. Students that do arrive after the 8:50am bell, are required to go to class via the office where they will need to collect a late pass, and so that they can be recorded as being late on Compass.

Recently there have been numerous students being picked up well beyond the school's dismissal time of 3pm, and even beyond 3:10pm when yard supervision concludes for the day. This is disrespectful of staff who are then required to perform additional supervision duty when other work should be a priority.

We completely understand that from time to time, mornings can be chaotic and unforeseen circumstances can pop up, making it very difficult to be on time. However, with good practices in place, including nighttime and morning routines, school drop off and pick up times should be able to be adhered to on a consistent basis. Where unforeseen circumstances do occur, we ask that families make contact with the school as a heads up – particularly where students are to be picked up late.

Please know, the school is here to assist you in any way it can. Please don't hesitate to reach out. And to those families who consistently get their children to school on time, and also arrive on time for afternoon pick up, thank you for your continued support.

Focus, discipline, hard work, goal setting and, of course, the thrill of finally achieving your goals. These are all lessons of life.


