

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





FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Celebrations!

At Willowmavin Primary School, we seek to create a school environment in which students are respectful and safe. To do this, we implement the School Wide Positive Behaviour Support framework. Basically, this framework is all about celebrating and recognising desired behaviour, which will result in positive behaviour thriving throughout the school. For Willowmavin, "desired" behaviour is behaviour that aligns with our school values - students being their best, students being respectful, students being resilient and students being safe. The SWPBS Tiered Fidelity Inventory Survey, is designed to assist the school in monitoring its effectiveness in implementing the SWPBS framework. Over the past week, we have been using this survey to assess the use of the school's rewards system (BRRS). As you can see from the below, we had very positive results. 100% of staff were not only able to identify the school's values, they had explicitly taught our school values to students. All staff had also given out tokens recently. As such, it was not surprising that 100% of participating students had received tokens this term. Whilst just over 13% of students were unable to identify all four school values, 100% of our students were able to identify at least 3 of our 4 values.





School Events

As families would have noticed from the many notices coming home, the school has a number of events coming up. Typically, we try to spread events out, however, sometimes this can be taken out of our hands when other schools are involved or booking availability is limited. Multiple events means multiple costs for families. And for families with siblings, even greater costs. Should you be experiencing any difficulties in paying for any upcoming event for your child, please don't hesitate to contact the office so that we can identify ways in which we can help.

Being Safe Online

When we talk about kids being safe online, we often think of online predators or children giving away personal details to potential scammers. However, there are many other potential dangers that we need to be watching out for when our kids are online. Sometimes, these dangers present themselves in rather innocent ways. Last weekend, my niece (a Grade 3 student) introduced my 7-year-old daughter to Roblox, a seemingly child friendly and fun online game where players can interact with other players in an online world which they create. Whilst the game itself seemed OK, my wife and I were quite shocked to discover that whilst playing, other games and ads popped up that were, to say the least, very different in content and purpose to Roblox – ones we were not comfortable with our daughter seeing or playing at her age. This highlights the need for ongoing vigilance when it comes to our kids being online.

Students at Willow regularly talk of being online after school or on the weekends. This space can be a fantastic resource for students to connect with their friends and peers, no matter how far they may live from one another. It is imperative though that parents and guardians are regularly checking in with their kids regarding their online activities and experiences. 
