












FROM THE PRINCIPAL

As secretary, Elsie has been responsible for recording minutes from the meetings, and has done so meticulously and efficiently. She has also regularly made presentations to Council, outlining our progress towards achieving the school's annual targets. Thank you to both Julz and Elsie for their commitment to our school. The 2 of you have given up your own time to drive the school's improvement efforts.

Reports Feedback

Speaking of Miss Rodger, on the following page of this newsletter, you will find the results of our 2023 Semester 2 Student Reports Survey. As we have done for a number of years now, at the end of each report writing cycle, we seek out parent feedback on their child's report. As you can see from the results, families were very positive in their responses. The inclusion of a sample piece of writing for parents continues to provide them with a greater understanding of their child's progress and understandings in Writing. In fact, 80% of parents responding to the survey indicated that this adaptation to our students' reports provides them with a far greater understanding of their child's abilities in Writing. The other 20% indicated a somewhat greater understanding was achieved from this inclusion in our reports. Not surprisingly then, 100% of respondents would like for our student reports to continue to include a sample piece of writing by the student. 100% of respondents also indicated they would like to see the student reports continue to include a student reflection – an addition to our student reports since Semester 1 last year.

As always, we will take this feedback into account when we commence our next report writing cycle next term.

Thank you to those families who took the time to complete the survey and to Miss Rodger for sending out and compiling the results.

Basketball Court Works

Some families may have noted that our basketball court has from time to time had pieces pull up and go missing. Considering the court surface is less than 18 months old, this is very disappointing. I walked over the court with the installers today and they have acknowledged the job that was done was not up to standard. As such, they'll return for maintenance works on the court in the near future.









Reports Feedback

Reading at Home



To support your child in developing the skills required to become a fluent reader, and complement the learning that takes place at school, it is important that children read at home every night. Students should have their reading diary signed and brought to school so that they are eligible for special awards and morning teas. This year, we will be having a special morning tea for students that reach 100 nights of reading by mid-year, as well as our 200 night end of year morning tea.

To engage with and support your child's reading at home, you may:

- · Ask questions about their reading. You could ask questions about the plot and events taking place, questions about who the characters are and how they are feeling, questions about the setting, or even questions relating to the author's purpose and the way they have conveyed their message.
- Ask them to retell what they have read.
- Discuss what is being read, talk about any pictures, images or diagrams present, read with them, read to them, let them read to you.
- For our junior students who are not yet reading, they may listen to books being read aloud. Students may also practise identifying letters and the sounds they represent.
- Discuss current learning at school and assist your child in applying strategies they have been learning in class to become better readers.

PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access
 to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the
 requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the
 Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the
 Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.




